The Georges Lurcy Charitable and Educational Trust offer fellowships to outstanding American doctoral students for advanced graduate study and research in France during the 2021-2022 academic year.

The Lurcy Foundation invites the broadest range of topics without exclusion of any field of study, time-period, or preference as to any department. However, the foundation prefers to fund research topics with contemporary relevance.

Eligibility

Doctoral candidates (PhD and DMA) who:

- Are U.S. Citizens or Permanent Residents
- Will be enrolled at Stanford or an educational institution in France during the tenure of the fellowship
- Have a research project connected to the contemporary French language, culture, or civilization

Funding

The Lurcy fellowship awards a stipend of \$25,300, which covers the cost of educational fees, necessary travel, and living expenses while in France.

To apply for the Lurcy Fellowship Program, the following application materials must be submitted:

Student Information

Complete the student profile and Lurcy online application. To access the online application at <https://humsci.stanford.edu/current-students/fellowships-and-funding> scroll down to Lurcy, click on the button “Apply Now”.

Project Title and Summary

A brief outline of the dissertation project no more than 1000 words. Your summary should:

- Include a brief outline of your dissertation project, highlighting its relevance to the contemporary French language, culture, or civilization
- Discuss your language skills for the research project
- Explain why you would like to study in France, as well as your anticipated length of stay in France

Curriculum Vitae

Unofficial Transcript

Attach a current *unofficial* Stanford transcript from Axess that lists your degree milestones. *Please do not submit an official Stanford transcript (including electronic transcripts).*

Undergraduate Transcript

Letter of Recommendation

A letter of recommendation from your academic advisor who should address specifically your eligibility for the Lurcy award.

It is highly recommended that you notify your advisor well in advance of the application deadline to provide them with adequate time to write their letter. In the online application system, you can request a letter from your advisor before you submit your application materials.
